Speaking:

Guglielmo can talk about the past, present and future using fairly complex sentences. Has a good range of vocabulary for everyday situations and is also able to discuss ideas and opinions in simple terms. Has to search for words in less familiar language contexts.

Listening:

Can understand most speech delivered at normal speed and can cope with quite long explanations and conversations. Can understand a variety of regional accents. Can make notes and paraphrase main content of a spoken passage. Can cope quite well with non face-to-face situations (radio, telephone and recorded materials).

Pronunciation:

Generally has a good command of stress and intonation and can produce most English sounds with occasional lapses. Is generally able to express mood and meaning through pronunciation patterns. Can normally be easily understood by the listener.

Reading:

Can read at a good speed and understand the main points of most texts. Can usually work without a dictionary unless reading for detailed information. Able to read all except specifically academic/technical/ literary texts and achieve an overall understanding.

Writing:

Good control of grammar and spelling. Style, including choice of vocabulary, is usually appropriate. Writer's intention is normally clear. Can produce quite long pieces of writing, effectively linking themes and ideas.
